LABBS Convention 2023

Convention 2023 update

Goodness, I've been in post as LABBS Event

Director for around a year, and Convention 2022 found me hitting the ground running. My thanks go to Faith and the rest of the Event teams comprising Stage Technicians, Couriers, Dressing rooms, Audio Visual expertise, Back Stage, Shows Manager, Front of House, Reception, Door Steward, and Contest Admin, for guiding, encouraging and generally making sure I survived! Also to friends who supported me with regular, much-needed coffee breaks and conversation.

It was such a joyous occasion after the long-lasting Covid restrictions. It was so glorious to be back singing, catching up with friends and generally having fun. The familiar sounds of spontaneous singing could be heard once again from under the stairwell, around a quiet corner, even in the local hostelry, and of course, the long-awaited afterglow in the bar area.

Prelims 2023 was held at Blue Coat School, Coventry, during what felt like the hottest weekend in June. Quartets of all ages and experience melted, dripped, and performed brilliantly to achieve one of the sixteen semi-final places.

Seven mixed quartets also participated in Prelims for the first time this year. LABBS wanted to offer them a home and a sense of belonging, rather than continue to be isolated with a separate contest on the Sunday afternoon at Convention, with a tiny audience. If the minimum BHS qualifying score is met, the Mixed Quartet Competition at LABBS Convention also satisfies the requirements for nomination by LABBS, to compete at BHS International. It is a win all round as we are enriched by their performances and enthusiasm.

Plans for Convention are taking shape. For those of you who are new to the barbershop world, while Convention is our annual singing competition, it is also a place to make new friends, catch up with old friends, maybe learn a new tag, or even to try extreme quartetting. Not forgetting the opportunity to explore Harrogate and perhaps visit the famous Betty's tea shop!

Convention Friday starts early at 09.45. You will be able to see the mixed quartets inaugural performances in the Quartet Semi-Final Competition, where 22 quartets will compete for 11 places in the Finals. It will be an amazing experience whether you are competing or an audience member. The Finals competition stretches into the evening, with 2022 Gold medallists Met 44 and IN HOUSE quartets treating us to mic cooler performances, before we find out who the 2023 medallists are. There will no doubt be an afterglow around the bar but the evening should finish at a reasonable time, with a not too late night (or should I say, early morning!).

Saturday is another busy day with 26 choruses who will have travelled far and wide, competing for medals. The amazing LABBS Youth Chorus will captivate us with their enthusiastic and engaging performance as they mic cool, and The White Rosettes, our gold medallist chorus from 2022, will mic warm and mic cool.

If you have never attended Convention before you are in for a treat. In addition to the competitions, there are opportunities to watch the best in UK barbershop during both the evening show on Saturday, and the Sunday morning show which will be such a fabulous way to complete our Convention weekend. Don't forget too, that we have a theme for the weekend: Tea Party. Many attendees dress up 'in theme' on Saturday evening, so do get your thinking caps on - what will your outfit be?



Our contribution to reducing waste this year has us ask that you bring your own leak-proof water bottle and use the free, fixed water towers around the venue for refills. You will also be asked to use your water bottle in the warm-up room before moving to the stage area. Paper will continue to be kept to a minimum, so watch out for information and updates on the LABBS website and our social media channels.

As I'm sure you know, LABBS is run by volunteers and Convention is no exception. Have you thought about volunteering for an hour or two while at Convention? Our Social Media, Door Steward, and Receptionist teams would all value your help.

Like all our household bills, the costs for putting on Convention have rocketed, and the team have been looking for ways to reduce what we spend. We cannot afford to provide an event with all the bells and whistles that we would like to, but if you have any ideas that could make Convention extra-special without breaking the bank, we would love to hear about them - please contact me at <u>events@labbs.org.uk</u>.

Convention 2023: Charities

LABBS has a proud history of supporting charities at Convention, and this year is no exception.

Yorkshire Air Ambulance is an independent charity providing a lifesaving rapid response emergency service to 5 million people across the whole of Yorkshire.

To keep both air ambulance helicopters maintained and in the air, they need to raise £19,000 every single day. The generosity that they receive really is the lifeblood of their charity, and we'll be helping them with a bra collection at Convention this year. Harrogate Homeless Project provides people experiencing homelessness in the Harrogate District, with a safe place to stay and the support they need to build confidence and move towards independent living. They operate a day centre, supporting people experiencing homelessness with day-to-day care, emergency overnight accommodation, a 16-bed hostel and move on housing along with a range of support services. We'll be collecting items for HHP at Convention, and would love to receive: UHT milk; squash; coffee; hot chocolate; pot noodles; tinned meats; milk chocolate; biscuits; cooking oil; tin foil; cling film; plastic food containers with lids; cleaning products (especially bleach and antibacterial spray); shower gel; shampoo; toilet rolls; dental products; laundry products; mens and womens clothing (hoodies, sweatshirts, joggers, jeans, summer-weight waterproof coats, trainers and (new) underwear in sizes S, M or L). represent LABBS at the Barbershop Harmony Society International Convention in Louisville, Kentucky. Accompanied by my daughter Gem, we arrived the day before convention, giving us time to settle into our 15th floor room with a great 'round the corner' view of the Ohio River.

The week was packed with contests. The Ouartet Quarter Finals took place on Tuesday and Wednesday with 60 quartets, including IN HOUSE and Hot Ticket representing LABBS, Limelight and Trailblazers representing BABS, and Lady Barbalade representing IABS. They all looked so comfortable on the stage and gave us excellent performances, with Limelight missing the semi-final cut by just four points! On Wednesday evening we watched

the Next Generation **Barbershop Varsity** Quartet Championship, with The Breakfast Club representing BABS as Youth Champions. There was a lot of British cheering as they won the fifth place medals - what a wonderful achievement!

On Thursday I attended the judges meetings first thing, then had the honour of presenting the International Quartet and Chorus Festival which was great fun. In the evening it was the Quartet Semi Finals (top 20) followed by the World Harmony Showcase featuring our British groups and some other stand-out performances, notably from the Pacific Islands - it was stunning and well worth the late night!

Friday brought the first two sessions of the chorus contest. and the Association of International Champions Show in the evening.

The show paid particular tribute to 1973 Champions, Dealer's Choice, and 1998 Champions, Revival, alongside many other past champions who performed for us.

Saturday morning was the third chorus session and included Meantime who represented BABS brilliantly. The Quartet Finals (top 10) followed. In addition to contests, there were educational events, open rehearsals, and fabulous afterglows.

These words don't come close to capturing the pace and excitement of the whole week. It was so inspiring to watch so many amazing performances, and to meet so many appreciative barbershoppers. Gem and I loved cheering everyone on from our seats just behind the judging area!

Since then, with our eyes firmly on the emerald prize, we've stepped up our rehearsal game with a slicker schedule featuring a steady stream of new arrangements to keep our singing heads switched on.

We're learning to be über careful with our choreo too - we have less riser-room to call our own now, having down-sized from a 10x4 step to an 8x4 step format to replicate the IABS stage conditions!

Plus we've taken our mega-hit Quartet Speed Dating idea to another level ... by turning tea breaks into Quartet 'Open Mic' seshes! With a fantastic five quartets competing at IABS this year (four of which are just doing it for the craic), these spots are a no-brainer for gaining performance experience. They aren't just for prepped and polished quartets either; anyone who fancies jumping in as a four-(or more)some is welcome to have a go. So far, four scratch quartets have sung in front of our massively enthusiastic AAC audience, surprising themselves with how much they loved the razzle dazzle and all the applause!

Beyond that, we've still got a whopper of a weekend retreat and a fab concert with the Knights of Harmony (this year's BABS small Chorus Award Champs) to squeeze in before IABS.

Fingers crossed, all the hard work and confidence-building will pay off and we'll be flying high in Ireland this October!

Coast to Coast goes hybrid!

Coast to Coast has made the momentous decision

to become the country's first Hybrid Barbershop Chorus! Members will meet on Zoom twice a month for eight months under Musical Director Angela Sanchez-Rosemurgey, and four times in-person for a weekend coaching retreat, a Polecat Jamboree, and two live-streamed physical rehearsals. Chris Wilkin, Coast to Coast Chair, explains:

"Members were finding it increasingly difficult to get to Leicester each month with rising travel costs and unreliable services. With the pandemic disruption and other social factors, on-line rehearsals were much better attended than physical rehearsals, so we decided to focus on these but still meet inperson four times a year. We will learn new songs as well as singing polecats, and hope that other LABBS members who find getting to rehearsals difficult, or who would like an additional dose of

barbershop, will join us. The more the merrier!"

This development is the latest in Coast to Coast's long history. In 1987 Sandra Hillyard asked Cath Morton if she would help create and direct a large chorus to enable those in small choruses to experience large-chorus singing, and to give those in non-competing choruses the chance to sing on the Convention stage. Cath agreed, and Sandra found a venue in Leicester. Amazingly, as longtime member Marion Morley recalls, over 100 came to the first meeting!

attended an intensive coaching weekend with Rob Mance on the 20th and 21st of May.

Rob was last with Fascinating Rhythm in April 2022, and the chorus was keen to meet him again and show him the results of the hard work members had put in. They definitely made Rob smile, and he remarked that the chorus had made a significant step change in vocal quality since he last visited. Rob also recognised the amazing work that the musical team had championed to gain this improvement.

All chorus members have worked incredibly hard over the last year, incorporating straws, using TE Tuner, and working on their own personal vocal instruction (PVI) to make vocal improvements. Rob was able to build on the work already done, and this time around focussed Fascinating Rhythm on pitch accuracy and breathing.

By the afternoon of day one, Fascinating Rhythm had identified some areas to work on in relation to pitch intervals, Rob had assessed the entire choir, giving new PVIs where needed, and he undertook a full assessment for effective riser placement. The new sound was awesome!

Fascinating Rhythm members were keen to get back to work on day two. During the warm-up, Rob remarked that he noticed an improvement just from the previous day. The session focussed on breathing, and most importantly, how to breathe effectively as a singer and how to relax. Understanding the anatomy of breathing was very useful, and Rob was able to dispel a few barbershop breathing myths. Fascinating Rhythm are completely floored by Rob Mance, as he teaches effective breathing technique for singing.

MD Jo Thorn commented: "The weekend was incredibly rewarding and the vocal quality produced by the end of the weekend was sublime. We've worked so hard over the past year and it was so encouraging that Rob recognised the significant improvements we have collectively made."

Chorus members remarked how relaxed they felt when singing on the risers,

Techie Corner (not really) - Websites!



Is your club or quartet considering revamping their website?

Debi Cox (that's me!) has been the LABBS Web Manager for a number of years, and she (I!) can help you with yours!

I took on the LABBS site when coding websites was my day job, and 'amateur' websites were starting to become a thing. Through the years, the LABBS site has been through various designs and content has grown considerably. The site used to be completely hand-coded and maintained by me, as I didn't trust the likes of Wordpress (and still don't!).

Then the HarmonySite platform came along. It was built by a barbershopper for barbershoppers, and that inside knowledge has made my role so much easier since we moved to the platform a couple of years ago. Everything makes sense, and there's tons of functionality built in that is actually useful and relevant to how we run our clubs and Association. The site owner 'gets it' and is helpful to boot, creating more bespoke tools to LABBS' requirements. If you are considering re-doing your club or quartet website, I would strongly recommend HarmonySite, if you want:

- a site that more users can collaborate on, to share the responsibility for updating it
- something easy to update, as it's very similar to formatting in a Word document
- a site which out-of-the-box is pretty much what you'd want it to be, but with complete flexibility if you do want to add content that's not standard
- a site that is automatically mobile-friendly
- a site that takes care of member logins, and is easy to manage for mailing lists
- lots of ready-made, useful, members-area options and tools, to help you run your chorus or group more efficiently than ever

Once you understand the basics of editing (very simple once you know how), and how everything hangs together, it's quite simple to create something that looks professional. Admin becomes so much easier than managing with Google Sheets and Doodles, so you can spend more time on the music.

There's even an option for an app now, if you want something more svelte to use out and about for the important stuff!

As a newly appointed LLO with a remit which includes (amongst other things) helping members in this area, if any club (or quartet!) wants to find out more about HarmonySite and what it can offer, for now or the future, is setting up a new HarmonySite website from scratch and need pointing in the
